Outline	On the evening of 3 Apr, a tropical low, which later developed into Cyclone Ita, triggered floods and landslides in the capital city of Honiara. Infrastructure damages to fresh water supplies, sewage system, electricity, roads and bridges were reported. 22 people were killed and two were missing.
